Not For Profit Law and the Incorporated Societies Act 2022

There are estimated to be 24-26,000 incorporated societies across NZ, and every currently incorporated society (including those incorporated as societies under the Charitable Trusts Act 1957) will be required, by 1 December 2025 to re-register under the new Incorporated Societies Act if the society wants to continue to have the rights and protections of being an incorporated society, and when re-registering it must have a constitution that complies with the new Act.

How the cyclone funds are being distributed

The below organisations have publicly published how they have spent or allocated funds received in relation to Cyclone Gabrielle.

New Zealand Disaster Fund (Red Cross)




New Zealand Red Cross have committed the full \$28.5 million - including all interest earned - to initiatives supporting people affected by the cyclone and other severe weather events. The Fund received approximately \$27.5 million in donations, and nearly \$750,000 in interest. Funding was distributed across three grant programmes:

- Partnership Grants Programme - providing funds to community organisations and other entities supporting community recovery.
- Response and Recovery Programme - supporting the immediate emergency response and helping communities recover by providing goods, services, and people. It also includes the Red Cross Home Bundles programme now underway.
- Resilience Investment Programme - providing funding to help affected communities prepare for, respond to, and recover from future emergencies and disasters as the impacts of climate change grow.

Cyclone Gabrielle Appeal Trust




Cyclone Gabrielle Appeal was launched to support and empower local communities to rebuild in a way that works best for them and complement other funding available to affected regions and communities to support their resilience to respond to extreme weather events.

A funding round of over \$14 million opened on 20 March 2024 and closed on 29 May 2024.

The Cyclone Gabrielle Appeal raised \$13,569,666. This amount, plus interest earned, enabled the Trustees to make grants to 558 projects aligning to the Trust funding round priority totalling \$14,137,699.

Community Organisation Grants Scheme (COGS)

Provides grants to community-based social services that contribute to local outcomes:

- ongoing operational costs
- community projects or events.

Tū Manawa Active Aotearoa Fund

Tū Manawa Active Aotearoa is a fund that helps **tamariki and rangatahi**, particularly **those that are less active**, to access a play, active recreation or sport opportunity **of their choice** in their community or school/kura.

Hawke's Bay funding rounds

Within Hawke's Bay we have \$680,000 available to distribute per year. The distribution of these funds are split over the following rounds.

- **Fast Fund** – Bi-monthly round – max \$10,000
 - Next round closes 10 December 2024

- **Full Fund** – Bi-annual round – max \$30,000
 - Next round closes 10 April 2025

- **Quick Release Fund** – max \$1,000
 - Open all year

- New application process
 - Applicant must discuss their project with a Sport Hawke's Bay representative before applying
 - tumanawa@sporthb.net.nz

What can be funded

- Project/programme delivery
 - Coach/official, where required for delivery of programme
 - venue or equipment hire
 - transport to event
- Equipment (only when it is needed as part of a project)

What can't be funded

- Capital costs / fixed assets
- Administration costs and ongoing costs
- Costs of retrospective projects
- Medals / prizes
- Kai
- Costs associated with representative teams (including uniforms, travel, accommodation)

Hastings District Council

Hastings District Council manages a range of grants available to community groups and, in some cases, individuals.

All grant rounds have specific criteria and are designed to enhance the lives of residents through events, programmes, services, and facility improvements.

Council grants are contestable so the success of your application will depend on how well your project fits with the criteria, the priority of the type of project compared with the others, and the money available for allocation.



Single Year Community Grant

Each year Council contributes funds to a diverse range of groups delivering community services or projects across the district. Organisations are able to apply for up to \$15,000 per year via the Single Year Community Grants for projects that provide innovative ways to help support the current and future needs of our communities.

To be eligible for funding, groups need to show how their project fits with one or more of the priorities below:

- Uplifting our communities' wellbeing by providing access to help and advice
- Fostering a sense of pride within our district and across our diverse communities
- Promoting happy, healthy and active communities.

Open March 2025

Multi-year Strategic Community Partnership Fund

Groups that have previously been successful obtaining a Single Year Community Grant and are providing a proven positive impact to the community, can apply to the Multi-year Strategic Community Partnership Fund.

Open March 2027



Creative Communities Scheme

Creative Communities grants are available for small local arts projects. The funds are supplied by Creative NZ, projects are generally under \$3000.

Open February 2025 & August 2025



Community Events Support Fund

The Community Events Support fund is available to not-for-profit groups holding community events in the district, generally these are free or low cost.

Currently closed



City Centre Vibrancy Fund

The City Centre Vibrancy Fund aims to support activities which improves peoples experience and enjoyment of the Hastings City Centre.

Open April 2025 & August 2025



Rural Halls Maintenance Fund

The Rural Halls Maintenance Fund assists rural communities with the maintenance, upgrading, and strengthening of halls.

Currently closed

Façade Enhancement Scheme

The Façade Enhancement Scheme financially assists the owners and tenants of eligible buildings to upgrade the façades of their buildings.

Open

Marae Development Fund

The Marae Development Fund assists with marae preservation and development in line with the Marae Development Fund Policy.

Currently closed

Youth Grants

Funding is available for young people aged 15 to 19. Youth grants are decided each year pending youth council decisions at the start of the year.

Open November 2025



Waste Minimisation Fund

Small grants

- Waste Minimisation projects under \$10,000
- Applications are considered each month from February to November

Large grants

- Waste Minimisation projects over \$10,000 and up to \$50,000
- Available twice per year for applications. August and February* (depending on funds)

School Waste Systems Fund

- A one-off grant for the purchase of recycling or compost bins.
- Up to \$4,000 per school, depending on school size.

School Recycling Servicing Fund

- Funding contributes to schools' recycling bin servicing costs. Schools can apply each year.
- Up to \$3,000 per year per school, depending on school size.

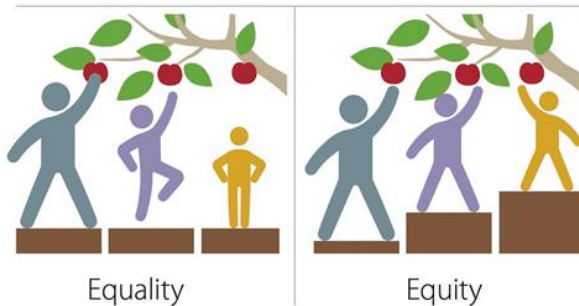

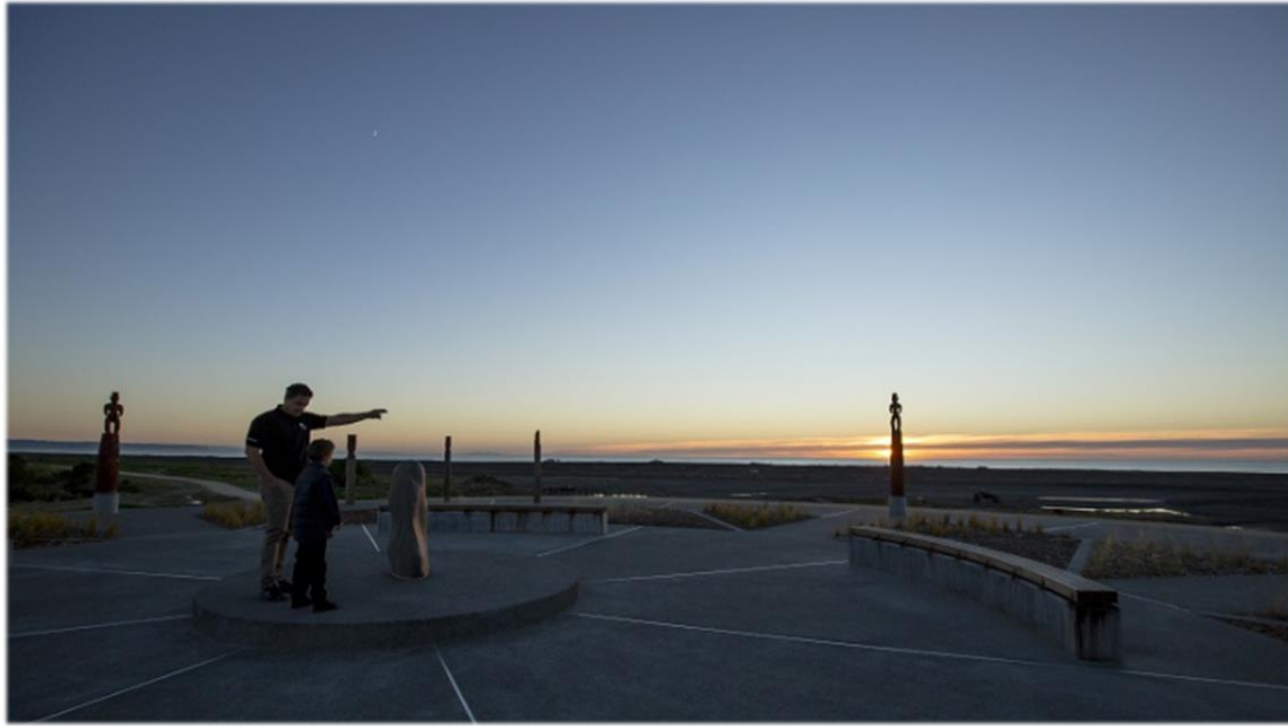

To support the PCL Net Proceeds Committee and Grants Administrators in processing grant applications and allocating grant funding.

- **First Light Community Foundation is a small Gaming Trust based in Hastings.**
- **We have venues in Hastings (1) and Wairoa and Mahia.**
- **There are four (4) Trustees who live in Hastings Havelock North and Taradale.**
- **All have been involved in various sporting codes and community groups over a many years.**



GRANT RECIPIENTS

- In the last 3 years 73% of Schools in the Hastings district have applied for and received funding for such things as laptops and I-Pads, classroom furniture, bikes in Schools programme, sunshades, sports equipment, travel, kapa haka, School trips and camps.
- Over 80 Schools and Community groups have been funded over the last two years. They have a huge positive impact on the health and wellbeing of our community.



COMMUNITY BENEFITS

- We distributed \$2,217,451 in community funding in 2023-2024.
- The government received \$6.8 million by way of taxes and levies.
- Hospitality businesses received \$2.9 million to operate the machines, they also pay taxes and are important employers.

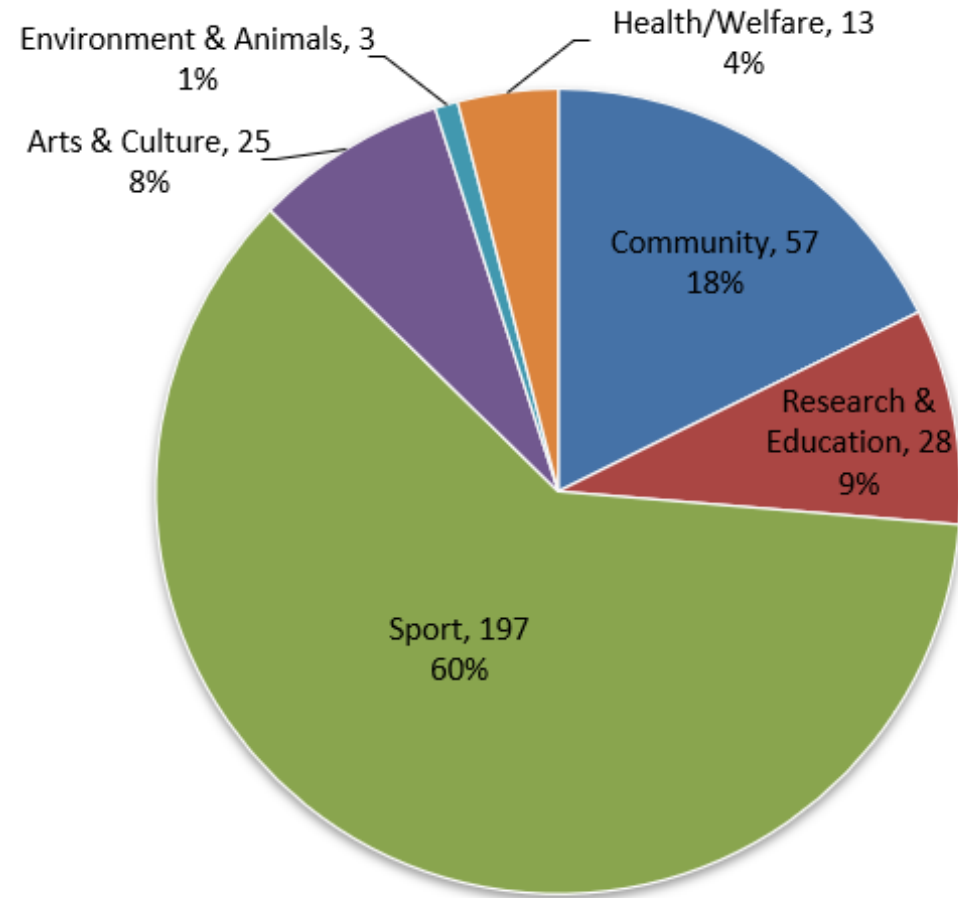

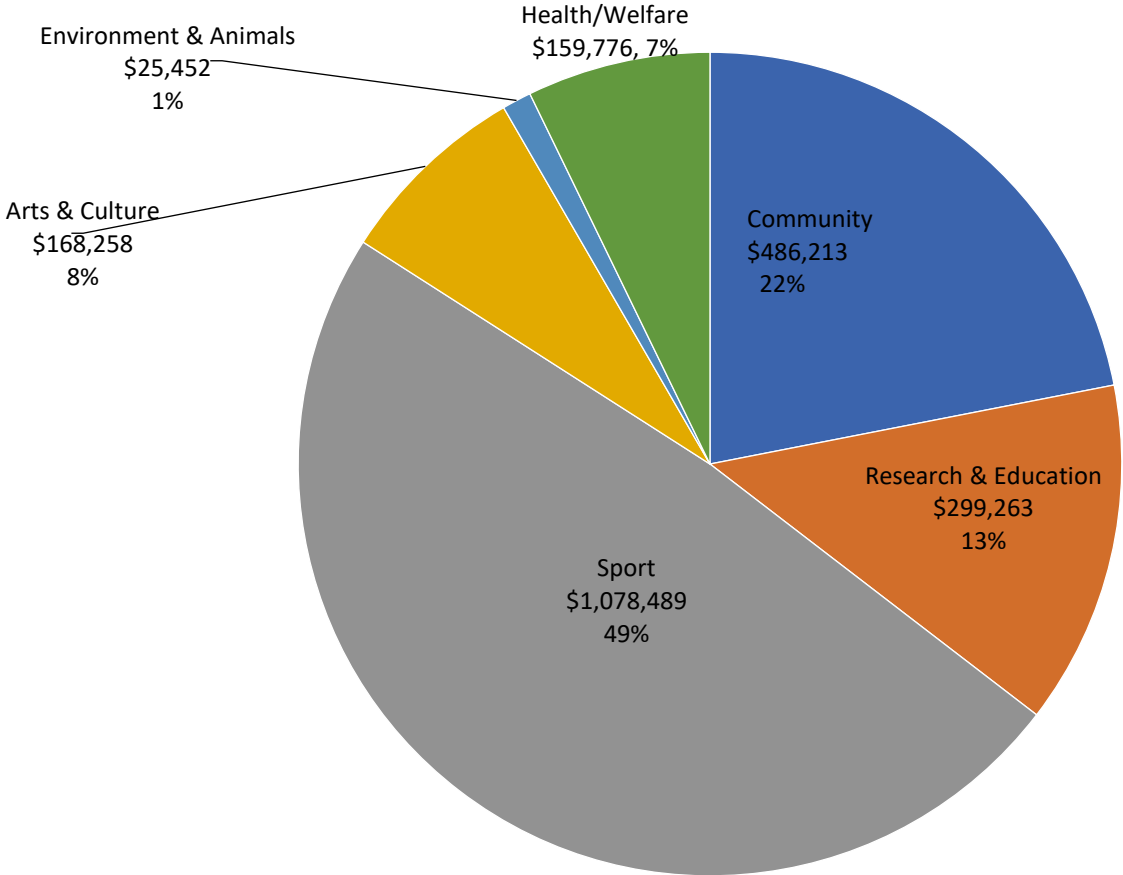
- We received 404 applications from April 2023 to March 2024.
- 80% were approved either partially or fully.
- 81 applications were declined for a variety of reasons, primarily due to lack of funds or falling outside Foundation or Department of Internal Affairs guidelines.



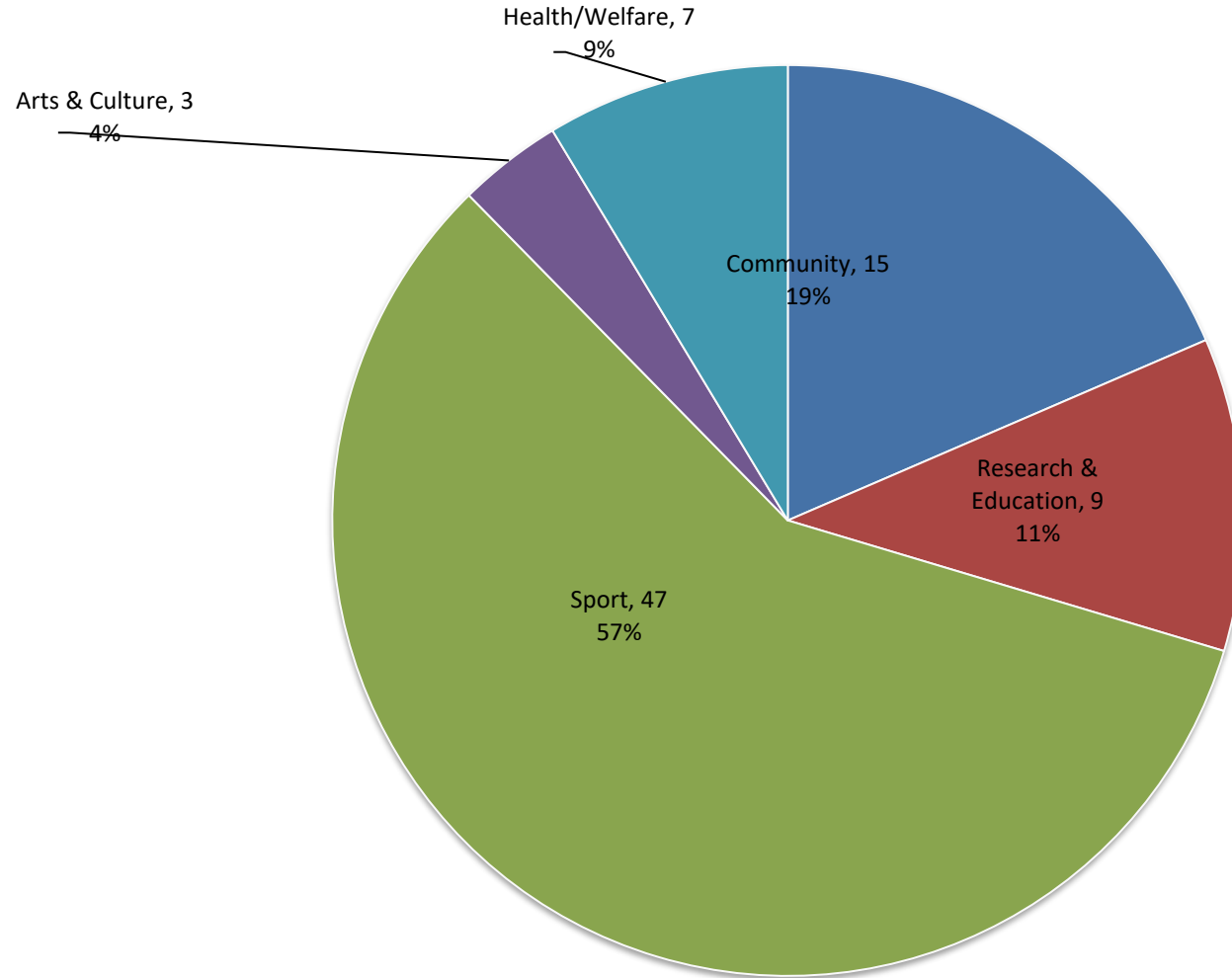
Total Number Approved Grants 1/4/23 – 31/3/24 - 323



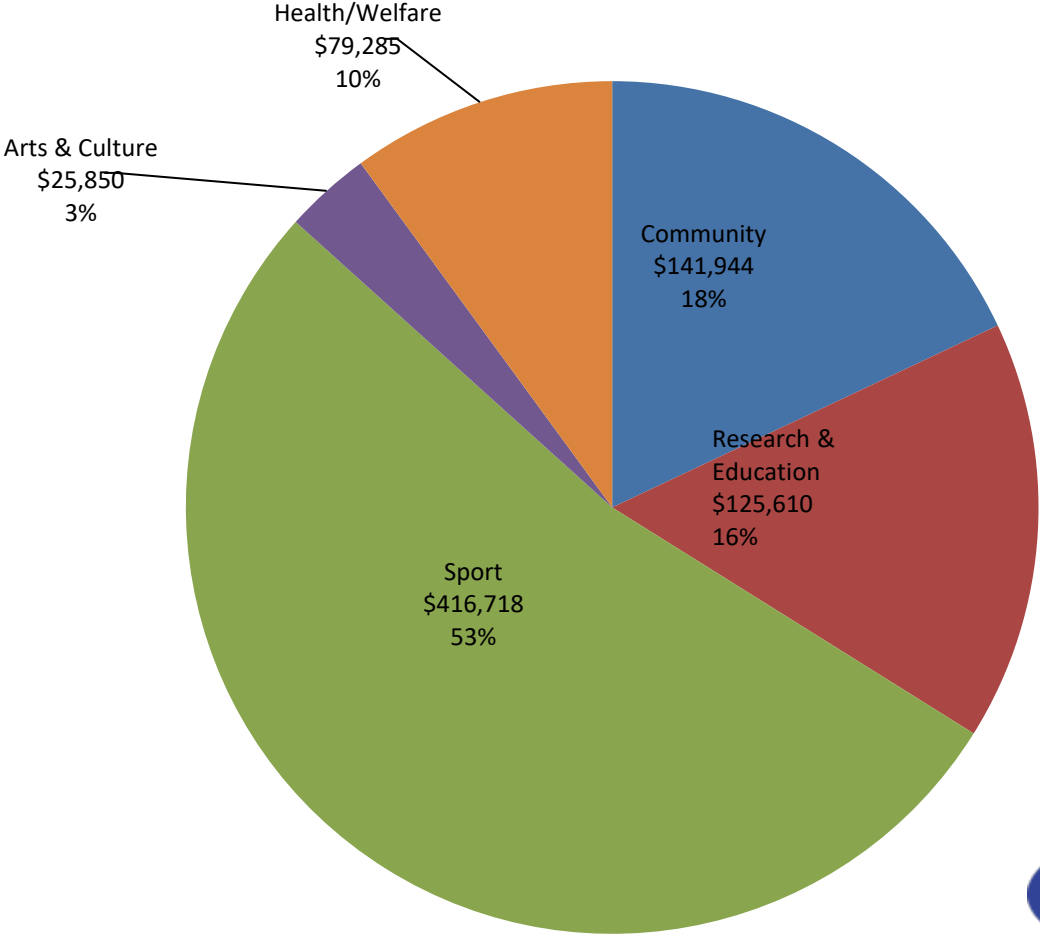
Total Approved Grants by \$ Value from 1/4/23 to 31/3/24 - \$2,217,451

Annual Funding

- Our Annual Funding Round **opens in May** each year
- Distributions are made in September
- Criteria:

You must be a **registered charity**

The bulk of your work must be benefitting the Hawke's Bay community

- Applications are made via our website (a sample application form is available online)
- All applications are assessed by our speciality Distributions Committee based on set criteria
- Follow us on social media to be alerted to when the funding round is open

Community Funds

- A Community Fund with HBF will ensure that your organisation receives a continuous income, forever.
- It's free to set up and your supporters can donate any amount to your fund, at any time during their lifetime or in their will.
- Relax, knowing the capital (the donations) – will never be touched
- Your fund begins generating investment returns immediately, which are re-invested to help your fund grow. Once your fund reaches the \$25,000 distribution threshold, 4% of the returns are paid out to your organisation every year.
- We look after the administrative work - there is no need to set up a separate charitable entity or file any returns.

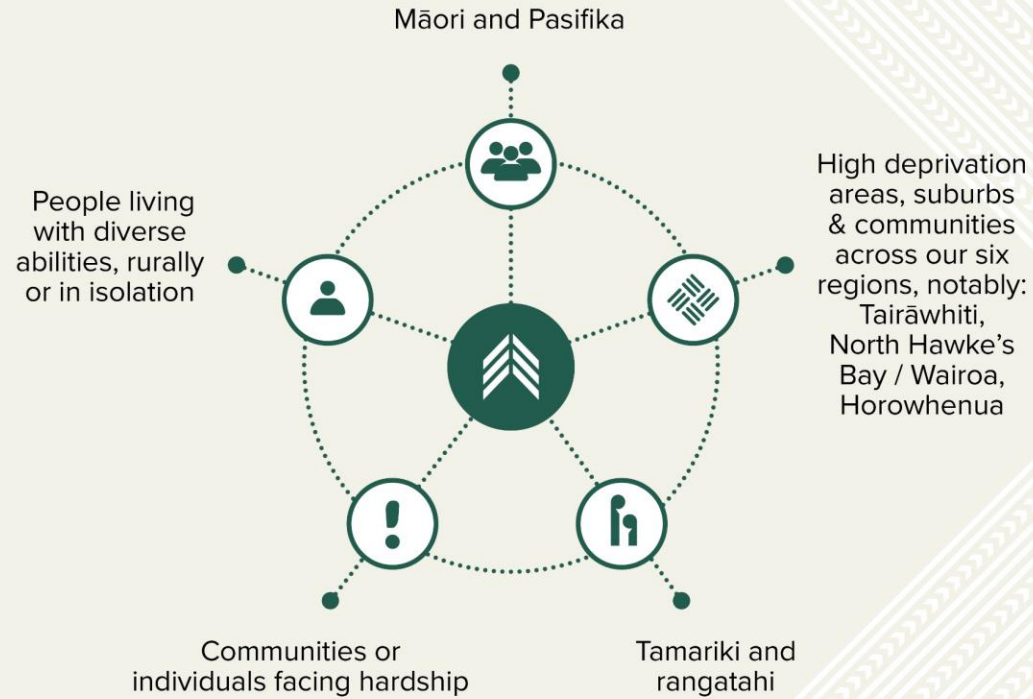
- Over the last 18 months ECCT has been on a journey to evolve our strategic plan and funding framework to move from transactional funding to transformational funding.
- Strategic Plan 2023-2030 was launched 1st April 2023
- New Funding framework launched on 1st April 2024 with a focus on priority communities and pillars of focus.

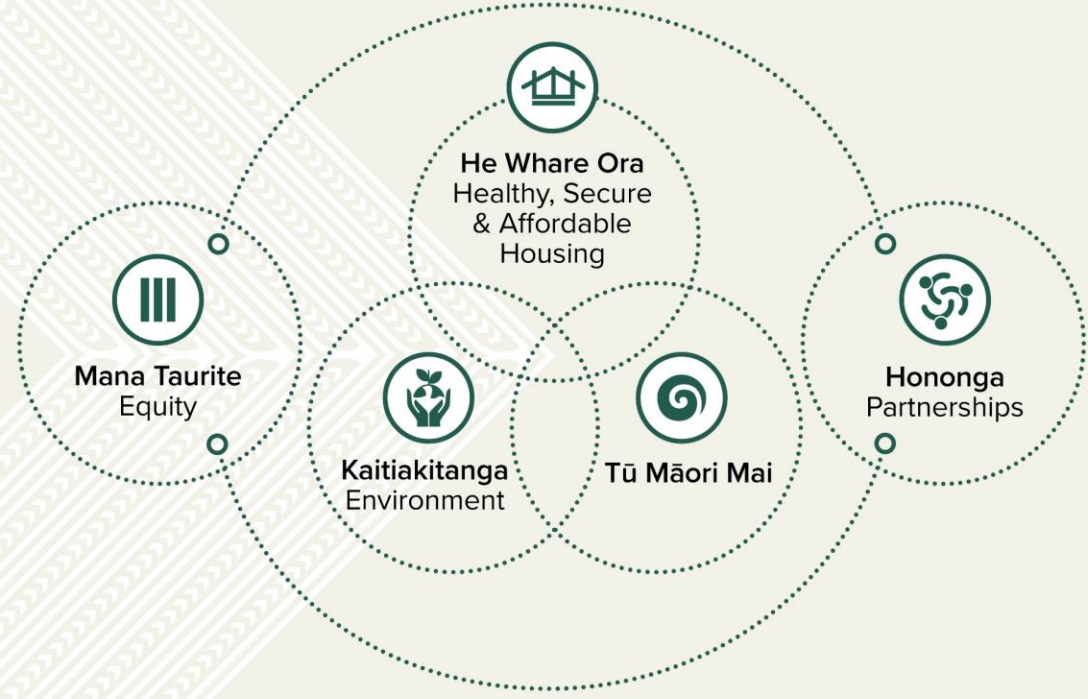

Ngā Pou | Our Pillars



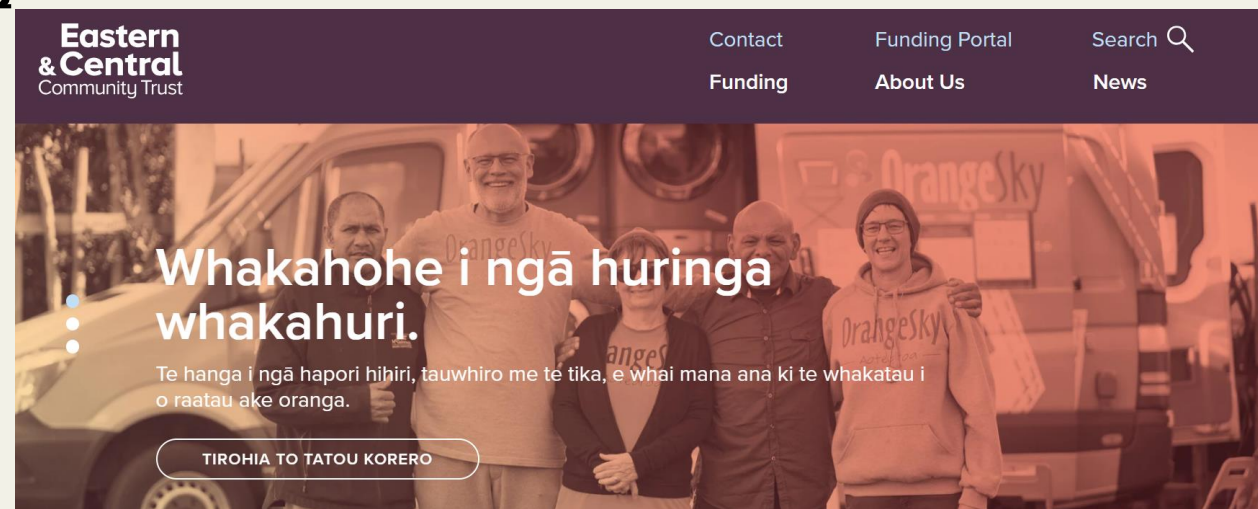
Our Funding Pathways
